### Changes to Social Security Numbers

Effective June 25, 2011, the Social Security Administration (SSA) is changing the way Social Security Numbers (SSNs) are issued. The change, referred to as "randomization" will prevent the SSA from running out of SSNs in certain states and it will also protect the integrity of the SSN and help guard against identity theft.

- SSNs will no longer be based on geography (state and local area)
- SSNs will be issued starting with the number 8 (it has never done this before)
- SSA will include all possible SSNs with the number 7 in position 1, rather than reserving SSNs beginning with 7 for certain states and specific groups (i.e. nonresident aliens receiving SSNs through the SSA's Enumeration at Entry program)
